

Ruthzee Louijeune, serving her third term as Boston City Councilor At-Large, is a grounded, inclusive leader focused on justice and shared prosperity. Born to Haitian immigrants and raised in Mattapan and Hyde Park, she began as a youth tour guide and later advocated for fair student assignment under Thomas Menino. As a lawyer, she defended families in Housing Court, protected voting rights before the U.S. Supreme Court, and advised Elizabeth Warren's presidential campaign. On the Council, she expanded reentry services, advanced affordable housing, strengthened public education, and championed immigrant and LGBTQIA+ rights. As Council President, she prioritized housing affordability, health equity, and civic engagement, becoming the first Haitian American to lead the body.
