

Darrick Hamilton is the University Professor and the Henry Cohen Professor of Economics and Urban Policy at The New School, where he founded and directs the Institute on Race, Power & Political Economy. He also serves as Chief Economist at the AFL-CIO. A leading public intellectual, Hamilton's work focuses on reimagining economic systems to advance equity, inclusion, and civic engagement. A pioneer in the study of identity-based economic stratification, his research has been widely featured in major media outlets. He has helped develop influential policy proposals—including baby bonds, guaranteed income, and a federal job guarantee—that have shaped national policy debates. Hamilton has advised institutions such as the U.S. Joint Economic Committee and Senate Banking Committee and serves on the board of National Bureau of Economic Research. Raised in Brooklyn's Bedford-Stuyvesant, he holds degrees from Oberlin College and University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
