

Bisola Ojikutu, MD, MPH is a physician leader, health equity researcher, and expert in the prevention, care, and treatment of infectious diseases. As Commissioner of Public Health for the City of Boston and Executive Director of the Boston Public Health Commission, Dr. Ojikutu is a key advisor to Boston's Mayor on health issues impacting the health of all city residents. Among other public health priorities, she is committed to advancing health equity and addressing racism as a public health crisis. Dr. Ojikutu is also an Associate Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School and a faculty member within the Division of Global Health Equity at Brigham and Women's Hospital. She also maintains an active clinical practice within the Infectious Disease Division at Massachusetts General Hospital. Dr. Ojikutu is a Fellow of the Infectious Disease Society of America, an alumna of the Commonwealth Fund Harvard Fellowship in Minority Health Policy, and a Milbank Memorial Fund Fellow. Among numerous awards, she has been named one of the most influential Bostonians and received the Catalyst for Justice Award from the Massachusetts Public Health Association.
